PHIL 321: SYMBOLIC LOGIC

Course Description

This course aims to provide a basic but detailed introduction to Symbolic Logic. We will begin the semester by discussing the benefits of studying Logic. Our first task will be to learn its vocabulary. It will be to your advantage to learn this vocabulary well at the beginning, as it will make it much easier for you to follow the course. The majority of the course time will be allocated to Propositional Logic. We will acquire the skills for doing Logic, such as constructing Truth Tables and Truth Trees, and making Derivations. We will then have a smaller part of the course devoted to Predicate Logic, its language, and to doing basic derivations in it. In Predicate Logic we will be able to express not only the relations between the propositions, but also the relations internal to them. After having thus developed skills in following logical connections, if there is time remaining at the end of the semester, we will turn our attention to arguments and processes of reasoning, in order to strengthen our abilities of Critical Thinking.

Quizzes will help you keep up with the material. We will have around 6 announced quizzes. They are meant to both make sure that you don't fall behind without realizing, and to help you acquire points in a way that is easier than the exams.

We will have one Midterm Exam and one Final Exam in this course.
