Course Overview

Developmental psychology investigates how humans change across the lifespan. This course will discuss physical, cognitive, and social-emotional development that occur across different phases of life and discuss how and why development takes place. Current issues in the field as well as how these issues are investigated will be discussed throughout the course.

Readings

- One or two articles or book chapters will be assigned most of the weeks. The readings will
 be available on SUCourse one week before the corresponding lecture. Students are
 expected to read the assigned text material before each lecture.

Grading

The course grades will be determined by allocating 35% to the midterm exam, 40% to the cumulative final exam, and 20% to a group presentation, and 5% to the recap quizzes. At the end of the semester, the letter grades will be assigned by using the following table.

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Exams. We will have a midterm exam (35% of the final grade) and a semi-cumulative final exam (40% of the final grade). Students will be tested on the material from lectures and assigned readings. There will be multiple-choice and short answer questions. The final exam will be semi-cumulative. The final exam covers the first half of the course (i.e., before the midterm exam), but some topics may be omitted (the instructor will be announcing these topics). You may take a make-up for a missed exam with an official medical excuse. To take a make-up, you must contact both the instructor and TA in one email <u>within three days</u>. In other words, if you miss an exam on Tuesday, you must contact us by the following Friday. More detailed instructions of the exams will be available when the date is closer.

Presentation. Students will do a 15-minute group presentation on one of the topics covered in the course (20% of the final grade). Groups will be determined after the add-drop period, based on the class size and availability. Students are expected to attend or watch presentations by other students. All presentations will be done using Zoom during the normal class hours (8:40-10:30 on Tuesday), but will be also recorded and uploaded on SUCourse.

Recap quizzes. Instead of taking attendance, we will have small recap quizzes throughout the semester (5% of the final grade). These quizzes are very simple, and you can easily answer them if you watch the corresponding lecture or student presentation. You will receive credit if and only if you answer the questions correctly. You will always have at least one day to complete the quiz. The recap quizzes account of 5% of your final grade. No late submission will be accepted.

Extra credit. As mentioned on the last page of this syllabus, students can participate in research studies to gain up to 3 bonus points. Some class activities may also count towards extra participation points. Students will receive extra points at the end of the semester for *regularly participating* in class activities and discussion.
