INFORMATION

This introductory course aims to help design students grasp the unique place of information visualization within the wider spectrum of Communication Design. It covers some of the basics of data visualization and investigates creative ways of shaping information.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The course consists of keynotes, discussions, assignments, class critiques and student presentations. Projects involve data collection, creation of charts, timelines, infographics and storytelling through the use of design elements. Time permitting, readings and viewings are also incorporated into class material.

WHO IS THE COURSE FOR?

The course is subject to special approval. Priority is given to senior (4th year) design students in the VACD programme; junior VACD and non-programme applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0. Non-programme applicants are advised to have taken at least one VACD course.
